MESSAGE FROM

Fr Benny

Dear Parishioners:

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCILS ARE IMPORTANT because in the Christian community, the diversity of charisms and ministries that derive from incorporation into Christ and from the gift of the Holy Spirit underlines that every member of the faithful is created for the building up of the whole Body and, at the same time, the whole People of God, having reciprocal co-responsibility for all its members, to participate in the mission of the Church, by discerning in history the signs of the presence of God and becoming witnesses of His Kingdom here and now.

Far from being simply a bureaucratic organ, the Pastoral Council highlights and realizes the centrality of the People of God as the subject and active protagonist of the evangelizing mission, in virtue of the fact that every member of the faithful has received the gifts of the Spirit through Baptism and Confirmation.

In light of this fundamental vision, the words of St Paul VI come to mind, "It is the function of the pastoral council to investigate everything pertaining to pastoral activities, to weigh them carefully and to set forth practical conclusions concerning them so as to promote conformity of the life and actions of the People of God with the Gospel", in the awareness that, as Pope Francis recalled, the purpose of such a Council "should not be ecclesiastical organization but rather the missionary aspiration of reaching everyone".

The Pastoral Council is a consultative body, governed by the norms established by our Archbishop. The norms in the Archdiocese are:

1. Spiritual Formation

- Enhance the vibrancy of parish life throughout the Archdiocese of Newark
- Deepen our understanding of our responsibility for the mission of Christ today

2. Parish Planning

- Promote our role as Missionary Disciples of Christ, called by God to use our time, talent, and treasure for the Gospel

3. Policy Development

- Assure that we are reaching the greatest number of people and inviting them to a closer relationship with Jesus through our Eucharistic liturgy, prayer opportunities, life-long faith formation, and community support
- Create a loving, welcoming community in service to all
- Foster an environment of synodality, collaboration, and sharing of ministries among parishes

4. Communications

- Be efficient in using the resources we have

TO ACHIEVE THE GOAL that our Pastoral Council effectively represent the community of which it is an expression in its membership, I have invited several people to serve.

Although the Parish Pastoral Council possesses a consultative vote only, that is, its proposals must be accepted by me, the pastor, to become operative, I am committed to active listening and open to new and challenging ideas that are well grounded and realistic. In this manner we will be efficacious and fruitful, avoiding two extremes: on one hand, my presenting to the Pastoral Council decisions already made, or without the required information beforehand, or convoking it seldom only pro forma; and on the other hand, that of the Council in which I am only one of the members, deprived de facto of my role as Pastor and Leader of the community.

I look forward to seeing this new development here becoming a helpful tool for our mission and ministry at Immaculate.

Let's pray for our newly invited pastoral council members and our parish family.




experienced in witnessing their growth and commitment was truly profound, and she cherished every moment spent together in faith.

DR. MARIE MARMO MULLANEY has been teaching history at Caldwell University since 1980. She holds a B.A. in history and political science from Seton Hall University and M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in history from Rutgers University. She teaches a wide range of courses in European history, American history, African-American history, the history of New Jersey, the history of Hispanics in America, and women's history. In recent years, Dr. Mullaney has expanded her research interests to include the history of Catholicism. For three years, she worked with Caldwell students as campus coordinator for the Sister Story oral history project, a national project which created an online archive of the experiences of American Catholic religious sisters. From 2018-2020 she was part of a Caldwell University team that brought the St. John's Bible to the campus community. Dr. Mullaney has been a National Merit Scholar, holder of a Danforth Foundation Fellowship, and winner of a Sears-Roebuck Foundation Excellence in Teaching Award. She received the Excellence in Teaching Award from Caldwell University in 2024.


